LIFE MEMBERSHIP FEE AND ANNUAL DUES **EFFECTIVE JANUARY 01, 2018**

Greetings from your National Board of Directors.

Please be advised that new fees and dues have been ratified during the Electoral College Assembly last July 20, 2017 at the Ceremonial Hall, Marriott Hotel, Pasay City.

Section 7 of Article VIII of the By-Laws states:

SECTION 7 - INCREASES IN FEES AND DUES - All fees and dues provided in these By-laws may be increased by the National Board of Directors as the need arises, and duly ratified by either the Electoral College acting as a Constituent Assembly or by the general membership as provided in Section 2 of Article XII of these By-laws. In no case shall any such increases be made oftener than once every two years.

Henceforth, effective January 01, 2018, the fees will be as follows:

- 1. Entrance Fee shall be increased from P 200.00 to P 1,000.00
- 2. Annual dues shall be increased from P 250.00 to P 1,000.00
- 3. Life membership fee shall be increased from P 5,000.00 to P 10,000.00
- 4. Charter Fee has a one-time fee of P 5.000.00 per chapter

Paragraph 2, Section 2, Article VIII was also amended as follows: "Fifty percent of the annual dues shall accrue to the chapter where such member belongs and the remaining fifty percent shall accrue to the PICE National". (As amended on July 20, 2017)

Membership dues of Student Members will remain at P 14.00 for new member and P 7.00 for old member.

For the avoidance of doubt, existing membership fees shall be collected up to 31 December 2017.





RISK IN CONFINED SPACES

DEFINITION:

confined space: Any enclosure having a limited means of entry and exit and not designed for continuous human occupancy. Any enclosure where the presence of air contaminants may be harmful to a worker and prevent his ability to escape unaided.

OXYGEN DEFICIENCY: A condition in which the atmosphere contains less than 19.5% oxygen by volume.

ENTRANTS: Who possessed the confined space entry as certified by 3^{rd} Party

SUPERVISOR: who possessed 3rd Party Training Certificate for confined space supervisory training course

STANDBY MAN: He is stationed outside the confined space and shall maintain line of sight or verbal contact with personnel undertaking confined space entry. He shall be trained and certified by 3rd Party

GAS TESTER: Confined Space shall be tested by Trained Gas Tester using calibrated Gas Detector

RETRIEVAL SYSTEM: Compose of Lifeline, Full Body Harness and a lifting device.

TRIPOD: This equipment is used for the rescue of injured or unconscious persons from a confined space.

TYPE OF CONFINED SPACE:

- Pipes
- Deep Trench
- Vessel
- Utility Vaults

PERMIT TO WORK SYSTEM:

- It indicates what precaution to take.
- The Work Permit should be displayed at the site before works starts.
- Authorizes entry into the Confined Space
- What work is to be done.
- · You must follow the conditions
- It is your safeguard.

CHECK PRIOR TO COMMENCE WORK INSIDE CONFINED SPACE:

- Method Statement shall be approved prior to work inside confined space.
- Risk Assessment shall be approved prior to work inside confined space.
- Supervisor shall be trained in Risk in Confined Space for Supervisory Course by 3rd Party
- All Entrants in the Confined Space shall be trained and certified by 3rd Party.
- Standby man shall be trained and certified by 3rd Party.

- Confined Space shall be tested by Trained Gas Tester using calibrated Gas Detector.
- Oxygen level shall be between 19.5 % to 23.5%
- Confined Space Permit To Work shall be approved prior to work inside confined space.
- Full Body Harness with lifeline shall be worn when working inside Confined Space.
- Tripod with Winch or Lifting Equipment shall be provided to retrieve unconscious workers.
- Respiratory Protective Equipment (RPE) shall be worn e.g
 Double Cartridge Type Respirator when using chemical inside confined space however,
- Use SCBA when Oxygen level is negative pressure.
- Use natural or forced Ventilation as necessary as practicable
- Provide copies of Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) and CoSHH Assessment as required
